CALL TO ORDER The meeting was called to order at 9:07 AM.

MILFOIL CONTROL PROGRAM OVERVIEW AND UPDATE The Environmental Services Coordinator (the 'ESC') presented Committee a verbal update on the 2015 Milfoil Control Program. The ESC reported that milfoil control work is ongoing (Shuswap and Mara Lake), utilizing two aquatic plant rototillers and harvesters in an effort to reduce the impact of milfoil. Milfoil growth in the Shuswap increased in 2015 due to a mild winter, low snowpack, reduced freshet, increased water clarity, warm sunny weather and low lake levels, which provided an enhanced growing environment.

The ESC presented a slide presentation outlining the 2014 program and results. Milfoil control survey of White Lake identified a suspicious plant which was sent to UBC for DNA analysis. White Lake is a marl lake (meaning a high level of calcium carbonate present) which limits milfoil growth.

MILFOIL CONTROL PLANNING COMMITTEE MEETING

In 2014, the harvester operated 22 days treating approx. 29 hectares and harvested 33 tons of milfoil while the rototiller operated 54 days treating a total area of approx. 28 hectares. Maneuvering around private docks and buoys present many challenges to the operations of the milfoil program.

In 2014 aquatic plant surveys were performed by CSRD staff in non-infested local lakes and consistent with previous surveys, no Eurasian water milfoil was found.

A public information and outreach signage display was installed at the Harbour Road Boat Launch with the project being partnered with Columbia Shuswap Invasive Species Society (CSISS) and the CSRD Parks Department. Electoral Area F Director suggested a possible location for a signage display would be at the Magna Bay Boat Launch in Area F.

An overview by the ESC of the 2014 program year end budget of \$281,179 identified a surplus of \$1,947.

PROPOSED 2016 MILFOIL CONTROL PROGRAM AND BUDGET

The proposed 2016 budget was presented to the Committee Members and discussed. The proposed 2016 program includes the provision to operate two harvesters full time in the summer and two rototillers full time in the rototilling season.

The capital budget allocation of \$40K is proposed for the purchase of a pickup truck for the second machine operator's use. Concerns from the Committee were expressed regarding this purchase and discussed further. Further clarification regarding the budget process was provided by The Team Leader, Environmental Health Services.

The current capital reserve account balance is \$85,362. The proposed budget for 2016 is \$326,419 which included the capital acquisition of \$40K.
